

These are the minutes from the August 3, 2010 meeting of the Hanover Board of Health. Present were Mr. John Dougherty – Chair, Mr. Walter Moran – Board Member, Mrs. Lynn White – Board Member, Mr. Anthony Marino –Health Agent.

Having a quorum, Mr. Dougherty called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

New Business:

Mrs. White moved to approve the June 22, 2010 minutes as written, Mr. Dougherty second, so voted unanimously.

Lynn White and Anthony Marino gave a brief update on information they had with regard to medication collection and disposal. Mr. Marino was waiting for additional information from Victor Diniak, DPW Superintendant and also stated that Chief Sweeney was interested in participating once we set a date.

Walter Moran arrived at 6:15 pm.

Mr. Marino updated the board with regard to the water test results from the North River and the high readings of Coliform. The Board reviewed the last three years test results and it appears that the results are actually improved from prior years.

Mr. Moran discussed the Title V variances that are given on reduction of depth to groundwater and he feels that we should take a closer look at whether or not the septic systems are in the aquifer protection district. Mr. Moran would like to have a map with the assessor's information on it showing the Aquifer Protection district available at all future meetings. Both Mr. Dougherty and Ms. White were in agreement and the board will consider the possibility of not allowing a reduction in depth to groundwater variance in the Aquifer Protection district.

Mr. Marino gave an update on the EEE mosquito pool status and what the next steps may be if Hanover were to have a positive test result. Currently Hanover is considered to have moderate exposure to EEE as we have a surrounding town with a positive test (Hanson). The Board also discussed the possibility and the need to close the sports fields around town from dusk to dawn if and when our status is increased to high risk. Mr. Marino informed the board of a conference call with DPH about aerial spraying and will update the board if Hanover is going to be sprayed.

The board reviewed all of the licenses and permits and signed accordingly.

Plans:

359 Plain Street – Mr. Moran moved to approve the proposed septic repair plan for 359 Plain Street, designed by Grady Consulting, dated July 6, 2010 with the variances as noted on the plan, Ms. White second, so voted unanimously. Deed Restriction.

577 Circuit Street – Approved

339 Old Town Way – Ms. White moved to approve the proposed septic repair plan for 339 Old Town Way, designed by Grady Consulting, dated July 23, 2010 with the variances as noted on the plan, Mr. Moran seconded, so voted unanimously. Deed Restriction.

22 Dwelley Avenue – Mr. Moran moved to approve the proposed septic repair plan for 22 Dwelley Avenue, designed by Morse Engineering Co. Inc., dated July 19, 2010 with the variances as noted on the plan, Ms. White second, so voted unanimously. Deed Restriction.

34 Dwelley Avenue – Mr. Moran moved to approve the proposed septic repair plan for 34 Dwelley Avenue, designed by Morse Engineering Co. Inc., dated July 19, 2010 with the variances as noted on the plan, Ms. White second, so voted unanimously. Deed Restriction.

Mr. Dougherty would like to have the hazardous waste regulations on the agenda for the next meeting on August 17, 2010.

Mr. Moran moved to adjourn, Ms. White second, so voted unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
