

Christmas at the Stetson House 2007: "Christmas Past"

This is the 26th year that the Stetson House has been welcoming Christmas to Hanover, and the theme this year is "Christmas Past at the Stetson House". Each room will choose a theme from the past which includes many favorites such as "Teddy Bear Christmas" and "The Twelve Days of Christmas". Many local residents and groups such as the garden club are involved in preparing for this festive weekend. The calendar of events includes:

Christmas Preview/Concert/Refreshments - Friday, November 30th – 6:15 to 10:30 p.m.

On Friday November 30th, the Stetson House will open its doors from 6:15 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. for a special preview. The House is at its best as the window candles will be turned on for the first time and the rooms glow with holiday cheer.

The opening of the Stetson House is followed by a special holiday concert given by the Harbour Choral Arts Society and the Hanover High School special VOX group. The concert will take place at St. Mary's Church at 8:00 p.m. After the concert, ticket holders are invited to the Congregational Church Parish Hall for refreshments and a social time.

Tickets are limited and are \$10.00 each. This includes an evening tour of the Stetson House, the concert and wonderful refreshments. They may be purchased at the John Curtis Library or at the Town Clerk's office on the lower level of the Town Hall.

This year's cut out is The Corner Store, an important landmark at the Four Corners focusing on Scott's Store, known now as Mary Lou's. Of course the building was originally Flavel's barn.
