The Year of Hearth & Home

In 2014 the Hanover Historical Society is centering our programs and tours on the theme Hearth & Home. The Society will be launching tours and events which will celebrate Hanover's agricultural past reconnecting with the towns past cooking, gardening, and farming. A new script will be added at the Society's two museum's The Stetson House and the Station Five Firefighting Museum. The Stetson House Museum will take a look at Hanover kitchens and gardens of the past, while the Fire House script will talk about the buildings very early days as Hanover First grange and the community dinners that happened there in the early to mid 20th century. This fall the Society will have our second annual Twilight Walking Tour series will visit the villages of North Hanover, West Hanover, and South Hanover this year and examine the dairy farms and crops grown in the area, hopefully with some funny anecdotes added in. Throughout the year there will be special programs including a talk on New England gardens on July 17th at 12:30PM by historian John Galluzzo and free pottery demonstrations at the Stetson House on May 10th from 2-4pm courtesy of the Hanover Cultural Council. This summer the Society is also starting a workshop series in our historic barn on historic crafts and horticulture. The Society is pleased to announce we will also be developing some education programs specifically for seniors including one on Hanover Kitchens this summer. Stay tuned as details develop!

VETERANS NEWS FOR MAY

The Social Security Administration has announced the launch of a new disability process to expedite disability claims filed by Veterans with a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) disability compensation rating of 100% permanent and total. Under the new process, Social Security will treat these Veterans' applications as a high priority and issue expedited decisions, similar to the way the agency currently handles disability claims from Wounded Warriors.

In order to receive the expedited service, Veterans must tell Social Security they have a VA disability rating of 100% permanent and total and show proof of their disability rating with their VA Notification Letter.

The VA rating only expedites Social Security disability claims processing and does not guarantee an approval for Social Security disability benefits. These Veterans must still meet the strict eligibility requirements for a disability allowance. For more information about this service, please visit:
