
New work orders this month: generated either by corrective action requests, scheduled preventive maintenance, or normal department operations.

Sharp rise in May & June due primarily to end of school year activities, teachers submitting work requests for summer, and Hanover Day support activities.



Completed work orders this month, generated either by corrective action requests, scheduled preventive maintenance, or normal department operations.

Fairly steady rate of Work Orders completed until June, where drop-off corresponds to staff vacations and absence of Deputy, followed by raised prioritization on completing long-term projects.



All work orders with Status of New Request, Work in Progress, Parts on Order, On Hold, Waiting More Information, Open Extended, or Deferred (includes scheduled PM work orders).

Significant rise in June due to additional amount of work orders generated in combination with lack of staff availability due to vacations/absences. Note that many work orders are created for prolonged periods such as regular inspections of elevators and fire alarm system.
