Getting to Know Hanover

Hanover was founded in 1727, approximately 50 years before the signing of the Declaration of Independence. We have preserved our charming "country town" ambiance throughout the years while nurturing a thriving commercial and retail landscape.

Today's population of nearly 15,000 residents still allows room for open space and woodlands, and most homeowners enjoy sizable lots, often with stone fences left over from a bygone era. Ponds, streams, and rivers, which join the historic North River as it flows to the Atlantic Ocean, provide both summer and winter recreational opportunities.

Hanover has nearly 1,000 business and professional establishments ranging from home businesses and "mom-and-pop" stores to national chains. Most banking, professional, retail, and service establishments are located on the four-mile stretch of Route 53, which runs north and south from the Towns of Norwell and Pembroke.

Light industry in Hanover are located mostly in West Hanover, off Route 139. State Highway Route 3, linking Boston to Cape Cod, runs through the northeast corner of Hanover, where it affords travelers easy access to the town. The proximity to Boston's Logan International Airport via Route 3 and the Southeast Expressway greatly enhances Hanover's attractiveness as a business or residential location.

Hanover has been fortunate to have residents willing to serve and protect our country for nearly 300 years. Tributes to our fallen service members are found at the Civil War Memorial across the street from the Hanover Town Hall and the Chair of Honor located within the Town Hall, dedicated to all soldiers still missing in action. The Veterans Memorial, located at the B. Everett Hall Field, is dedicated to veterans from World War I, World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. Along with Hanover's many memorial and historical sites, there are many recreational areas throughout the Town, including Forge Pond Park, B. Everett Hall Field and Park, Ellis Field, Ludden's Ford, and Sylvester Field.

Town Government Introduction

Two foundational documents govern the Town of Hanover: The Town Manager Act and The Town of Hanover General Bylaws. These two documents provide the scaffolding for local government in Hanover, offering overarching directives for decision-making. The Town operates under an Open Town Meeting - Select Board - Town Manager framework.

Town Meeting: Town Meeting voters are the legislative branch of Hanover's Open Town Meeting form of government. This means that any (and all) registered voters in Hanover can participate in Town Meeting. Town Meeting members make important decisions including approving the annual operating budget(s), capital budget requests (examples of which include the purchase of vehicles and appropriations for new buildings such as a fire station or a school), approving new or amended Bylaws and land use regulations.

- **Town Moderator:** The Town Moderator presides over all Annual and Special Town Meetings.
- **Advisory Committee:** This nine-member committee, appointed by the Town Moderator, reviews and vets all articles up for vote at all Annual and Special Town meetings and makes recommendations to the full legislative body.

Select Board: Comprised of five elected members-at-large who serve for staggered three-year terms, Hanover's Select Board is the chief executive and policy-making body of the Town.

Town Manager: The Town Manager is the chief executive of the administrative operations of the Town and is responsible for effectively managing all affairs and carrying out policy objectives of the Select Board while honoring decisions made by Town Meeting voters. CODERED EMERGENCY ALERT NOTIFICATIONS

Getting Established

The Town of Hanover offers a range of resources to assist you in every step, from understanding local regulations, registering to vote, and obtaining necessary permits to connecting with essential services like water and electricity. The Town Hall serves as a helpful hub where you can find information, ask questions, and complete required paperwork.

WATER CONNECTION AND TRANSFER STATION STICKERS

New residents are required to change their water billing address. This process may be completed in person at the Department of Public Works, located at the Sylvester School building, 495 Hanover Street. Residents may also register for a free transfer station sticker during their visit. Proof of residency and vehicle registration information is required. REGISTER TO VOTE AND BE COUNTED

Residents may register to vote at the Town Clerk's Office or Registrar's Office. Special voter registration hours are provided before any election or Town Meeting. Visit [Hanover-MA.gov/Vote](https://hanover-ma.gov/Vote).

Hanover is mandated by state law to conduct an annual census. Census forms are sent to households each year on the first of January. DOG LICENSING

Parents/guardians of new students are encouraged to register their children in the Hanover Public Schools by visiting or calling the appropriate school office before the start of the school year. ANIMAL CARE AND CONTROL

Hanover's Animal Care and Control is a dedicated and compassionate resource for ensuring the welfare of animals in our community. Our Animal Care and Control Officer is responsible for helping to reunite lost pets with their families, lends support to injured and orphaned wildlife through collaboration with regional rehabilitators, and serves as an educational asset for the community. TOWN CLERK

The Hanover Town Clerk's Office oversees elections, the early voting processes, and the issuance of absentee ballots. Additionally, the office is responsible for candidate nomination papers and the swearing in of town officials and committee members. The office keeps campaign finance records and offers various services including the issuance of birth certificates, marriage licenses, death certificates, and burial permits. The office also issues dog licenses and business certificates. Visit Hanover-MA.gov/Clerk.

TREASURER/COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

The Hanover Treasurer/Collector's Office is accountable for the management of real estate property tax billing and payments, public water-related billing and payments, excise tax billing and payments, and personal property tax billing and payments. The office records tax titles, issues municipal lien certificates, bills and accepts payment for police false alarms and license to carry, and accepts payment of parking tickets and civil disposition citations. Online bill payment is also available.

VETERANS

The Hanover Veterans' Services Office provides support by assisting in the application process for a broad range of federal claims. Voting and Town Elections

LOCAL ELECTIONS

The Annual Town Election is held every year in May. The polls are located at Hanover High School, 287 Cedar Street. Visit [Hanover-MA.gov/Elections](https://hanover-ma.gov/Elections).

PRIMARIES AND GENERAL ELECTIONS

Early voting for primary and general elections is facilitated at the Hanover Town Hall. Voting on Election Day for county, state, and federal elections takes place at Hanover High School. Visit [Hanover-MA.gov/Vote](https://hanover-ma.gov/Vote).

REGISTERING TO VOTE

Outdoor Recreation

B. EVERETT HALL FIELD

B. Everett Hall Field is located in the center of town. It includes the B. Everett Hall Playground, two baseball fields and a softball field, two full-court basketball courts, a tennis court, and the Sergeant Michael C. Chesna Hockey Rink.

BRIGGS FIELD

Briggs Field is usually used for tee ball and is situated next to the historic Briggs Stables. This stable has belonged to the Briggs family since 1854, and is still in use to this day. The field is situated across from the Hanover Town Hall.

CEURVELS FIELD

Ceurvels Field is located off Myrtle Street. The field consists of a basketball court and lacrosse and baseball fields. The wooded area behind these fields is home to a section of the trail network in Hanover.

ELLIS FIELD

Ellis Field combines four of Hanover's little league baseball fields. The fields pay tribute to Calvin J. Ellis Jr., who was born in Hanover on January 24, 1921. During World War II, First Lieutenant Ellis Jr. served as a Bombardier in the U.S. Air Force. He was killed on April 4, 1945, in Germany. Calvin J. Ellis, Jr. was awarded the European Theatre Ribbon with four Bronze Stars, the Air Medal with three Oak Leaves, a Presidential Citation with Oak Leaf Cluster, and the Purple Heart.

FORGE POND PARK

Forge Pond Park, Hanover's first tournament-based facility, has three baseball fields, three softball fields, three multi-use fields, a 1.5-mile paved walking path, access to a vast network of trails, and a pavilion with concessions and restrooms. The park is well visited, year round.

HANOVER HIGH SCHOOL TENNIS COURTS

Eight professionally remodeled tennis courts at Hanover High School invite community members to play tennis when the courts are not being used for school-related activities. These courts are located at 287 Cedar Street, in front of the high school.

HANOVER HIGH SCHOOL TRACK AND TURF FIELD

The Hanover High School track and turf field is available to all residents when the facility is not being utilized by students and sports teams.

Outdoor Recreation

LUDDEN'S FORD PARK

Historical Ludden's Ford Park was home to the Clapp Rubber Mill of 1873, the largest rubber mill in America. As a historical site, it was also home to the Curtis Anchor Forge dating back to the 1700's. The 22-acre area is named after James Ludden, famous for guiding Governor John Winthrop across the river to visit William Bradford, Governor of Plymouth Colony, in 1632. Today, this site is valued for its hiking and walking trails. Fishing, kayaking, paddling, and picnicking in the natural habitat provides area residents an enjoyable experience.

SERGEANT MICHAEL C. CHESNA MEMORIAL HOCKEY RINK

Sergeant Michael Chesna was a police officer for the Town of Weymouth and a resident of Hanover who was tragically killed in the line of duty. Additionally, Sergeant Chesna was a six-year U.S. Army Veteran and a Purple Heart recipient. The Sergeant Michael C. Chesna Memorial Hockey Rink is located at the B. Everett Hall Field.

SYLVESTER FIELD

Encompassing a small pine grove and 660 feet of frontage on Third Herring Brook in Hanover's Four Corners neighborhood, Sylvester Field's highly-visible 10-acre meadow and stone wall bordering Washington Street is a cherished part of the town landscape. This property has long served as an agricultural, ecological, and historic resource.

HANOVER BRANCH RAIL TRAIL

Built on an old railroad bed, the Hanover Rail Trail connects West Hanover to Abington through Rockland. Perfect for walking, jogging, and biking, this trail provides a peaceful escape for outdoor enthusiasts and nature lovers alike. A parking lot is available near the intersection of Hanover Street (Route 139) and Circuit Street.

CARDINAL CUSHING CENTERS

Located on a 175-acre campus in Hanover, Cardinal Cushing Centers opened in 1947. The school has been a place where children and adults with disabilities have found possibilities, opportunities, and hope. Archbishop Richard Cushing of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston was the driving force behind the creation of the center purchasing land for its campus in 1947 after appealing to Kennedy family patriarch Joseph P. SOUTH SHORE REGIONAL VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL HIGH SCHOOL

South Shore Vocational Technical High School is a public high school located at 476 Webster Street in Hanover. The school serves roughly 600 students in grades 9 through 12. The South Shore Regional School District, through its vocational technical high school and adult education programs, serves as a renowned educational institution and community resource for all students who seek to explore, develop, and enhance career and technical skills. Additionally, the school prepares students from Hanover, Norwell, Scituate, Hanson, Pembroke, Rockland, Whitman, Abington, and Marshfield, for future college and technical endeavors.
