In accordance with the provisions of M.G.L. c. 148 § 13, the following amounts of flammable and combustible liquids, flammable solids or flammable gases may be kept, stored, manufactured or sold without obtaining a license from the Board of Selectmen. However, a permit is required from the Hanover Fire Chief.

Class IIIA liquids	10,000 gallons

- ≠ In storage tanks having a liquid capacity that exceeds 60 gallons capacity, intended for fixed installation, and not used for processing.
