March Minutes Unanimously Approved

Presentation by Samantha Woods, Executive Director, North South River Watershed Association (NSRWA)

- Goal-protect through river restoration projects
- Two Dams in Hanover- Luddams Ford (50% Hanover/Pembroke) and remnants at Cross Street/State Street
- Impacts of Dams on Rivers
 - -block fish, warm temperatures, trap sediment/nutrients, degrade water quality
 - River Herring (Blueback herring and Alewife) populations in trouble (
 - over 3000 dams in MA, many no longer serve a purpose (only about 200 serve a purpose- hydropower or flood control)
- On South Shore 22 removed, 122 remaining, 16 miles of newly opened river
- Benefits: eliminate liability for owner (private/public-poorly maintained, more and more vulnerable to problems), restore habitats, helps with climate change resilience
- Dam removal versus repair
 - Luddams Ford- 200K repair estimate (minimum/not to code)
 - Removal can be 300K up to 1mil (one time), can be funding/grant resources available which NSWRA can help navigate
- Process (3-5+ years)
 - Feasibility (mapping, assessment, community) initial report done by end of June
 - Desktop analysis- minimal scope 30K from DER
 - o Design, engineering, permitting
 - Construction
- Examples: Town Brook Plymouth & Jones River, Kingston, Third Herring Brook, Hanover/Norwell, Bound Brook, Cohasset/Scituate
- Luddams Ford (Curtis Crossing). Built 1908
 - Owned by both
 - 2016 inspection report = poor
 - Fish ladder unclear how effective it is (impossible to access or repair)
 - Water is 10 degree difference (fish can't survive with less oxygen)
- Future Partnerships
 - Division of Ecological Restoration (DER)
 - Natural Resource Damages Trust Fund

- Hanover/Pembroke as owners would be applicants, NSWRA/MassBays would assist in the application process and throughout the process at it moves forward
- Samantha Woods will be reaching out to towns to see if they would like to get move forward with getting \$/additional research with Natural Resources Damages Trust Fund
