



**Community Preservation Committee

The following minutes are from the meeting of the Hanover Community Preservation Committee held on Thursday, October 12th, 2017, in Hanover Town Hall.

The Chairman William Scarpelli opened the meeting at 7PM.

The Committee reviewed the four applications submitted. The Board went through the application submitted by Town Hall for funds to complete Phase II of the Town Hall reconstruction process. The Committee asked for some revisions and additional information to be added to the application for the next meeting. The Committee moved on to review the application submitted by Board of Selectmen through the Town Clerk for money to reconstruct the Prouty Plow and Constitution Anchor in front of Town Hall. The Committee questioned the applicability of this particular application for CPC funds because the plow currently out there is a reconstruction and not historical. The Committee reviewed the Multi-Use Recreational Facilities Committee application for the funding for multi-use recreational street hockey facility. The Committee requested the costs for the items be itemized out and have the line items with actual costs. Additionally, the Committee requested Park and Recreation be added to the application and for Michaela Shoemaker to send the Committee Planning Board's decision for Build the Boards. Last the Committee reviewed the application submitted by Hanover Historical Commission.

The Committee decided to have scheduled interviews with the applicants at the next meeting on November 15th starting with the Multi-Use Recreational Facilities Committee, Town Hall, Hanover Historical Commission, and last the Board of Selectmen submitted by Town Clerk.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
