Meeting Minutes:

Mr. Farwell moved to approve the May 9, 2017 minutes, Mr. Dougherty seconded the motion; all in favor.

New Business:

Mrs. Nancy Funder, Public Health Nurse/Food Inspector:

Surveillance & reporting: including tick-borne illnesses and discussion of vector-borne disease precautions.

Food inspections & Camp Inspection are ongoing.

PHEP grant information for Grant year BP1 2017-2018; discussed how the money is spent, including on MRC Consultant Dawn Sibor.

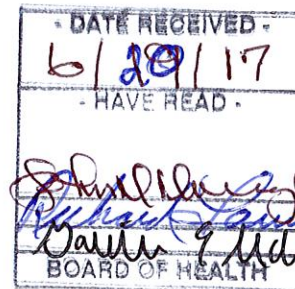
Fall Flu clinic preparations: including plans for a full-scale, functional emergency dispensing site exercise being planned for October 2017. Utilizing Dawn Sibor as consultant, the exercise will utilize Medical Reserve Corps volunteers and others to set up an EDS and provide flu shots to the public.

Discussion with board members re: opioid crisis and possible actions to be looked into. First step to ask for Fire Department and Police Department to come to a meeting to get information on the numbers of overdoses or ambulance runs for opioid issues. Anthony Marino will reach out to the other departments.
