## Go Native at the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Gardening Green Expo!

Think spring and mark your calendar for Gardening Green Expo. The theme for this year is "Go Native!".

Populations of birds, bees, butterflies, and other pollinators are declining worldwide, but there are things you can do to make a difference. You can support pollinators by planting native plants! Pollinators evolved with native plants, which are best adapted to your local climate, soil, and growing season, and usually require less water than imported ornamentals. Many butterfly and moth larvae also feed on a specific native plant species. You don't need a huge garden to help out, any small planting will do. Even the smallest piece of land, window box or container garden can help support pollinators. Gardens planted with the right plants can create a network of habitat connections in an increasingly fragmented environment. Choosing plants that flower at

different times of the year can provide nectar and pollen sources throughout the growing season. You can do your part by using native plants to create pollinator friendly gardens.

At Gardening Green Expo you can stroll through the greenhouses at Kennedy's Country Gardens and visit with vendors of products and services that will help you get the best out of your garden and lawn. There will also be talks by local experts and environmental organizations (stay tuned for topics and times). In conjunction with the expo, NSRWA will be taking orders for rain barrels and composters again this year. The "Ask a Master Gardener" team will be onsite to answer horticultural questions from 10:00am-3:00pm and their "Soil Team" will be onsite to test soil from 10:00am-2:00pm.
